## Alberta Dental Association and College Hearing Tribunal Decision

## IN ACCORDANCE WITH BYLAW 19(7) OF THE ALBERTA DENTAL ASSOCIATION AND COLLEGE

On April 12, 2021, a Hearing Tribunal of the Alberta Dental Association and College found Dr. Curtis Westersund guilty of unprofessional conduct and he was sanctioned. A Hearing Tribunal is an independent group of decision makers comprised of a member of the public appointed by the Government of Alberta and three dentists registered in Alberta.

Dr. Westersund admitted that he failed to create or maintain adequate patient records; failed to conduct an appropriate clinical examination; failed to arrive at a definitive diagnosis before proceeding with treatment; proceeded with the next stage of treatment involving permanent crowns when the patient was not asymptomatic for an appropriate period of time and/or failed to re-evaluate the treatment plan and/or perform further diagnostic tests and investigations or obtain consultation from a dental or medical specialist before proceeding with the next phase of treatment; and failed to obtain adequate informed consent from the patient. Dr. Westersund further admitted that such conduct constituted unprofessional conduct.

## ORDERS OF HEARING TRIBUNAL

The Hearing Tribunal accepted Dr. Westersund's admissions and agreed the admissions were proven and constituted unprofessional conduct under the Health Professions Act. The Hearing Tribunal accepted the Joint Submission on Penalty and issued the following orders on sanction:

- 1. He will be suspended for six weeks;
- 2. He will complete a professional ethics course, at his own cost and which will not count towards his continuing education credits; and
- 3. He will pay 75% of the costs of the investigation and hearing.
